USASA AMATEUR COMPETITION PROGRAM

An East Coast based Amateur organization, the USASA (the United States Amateur Skateboard Association) has a policy and outline that looks super.

Originated by Richard Acunto, the organization presently has 70 member skateparks on the East Coast. Under the leadership of state directors, each park in a state will have one contest per month. Points are awarded to competing skaters who are members of the USASA. Non-members are welcome to compete but do not accumulate points.

As a skater joins he is assigned an A status. After he wins a first or second place twice in the same event he is then a AA competitior. Again, as he wins a first or second place twice in the same event, he advances to the AAA class. This constant, upward promotion keeps the competitions fun and challenging at all levels.

The top winners in each state are eligible to compete in each state's championships in September. A regional contest is planned for October and national championships in November. A skater may compete in out-of-state contests but only gain points in the state he lives in.

Events are broken into four age divisions: 11 and under, 12 to 14 yeras, 15 to 17 years, and 18 and over. With the three Classes (A, AA, AAA) there are numerous categories of competition. For example, in one contest there

would be an 11-14 A, and 11-14 AA, and an 11-15 AAA Slalom race.

Research was done into AAU and ISA regulations as USASA developed its format. They were careful not to conflict with either primary organization. The USASA defines a professional as any skater who has received cash in ANY sport. This definition, taken from the AAU, is strictly enforced. There has already been an account of a youth having won money a year ago. He claimed that without competing in a year's time, he was again eligible for amateur status. The USASA claims, "not so." There is an allowance for a skater to compete in a pro event, win money, and remain an amateur, IF he acclaims publicly that he wishes to keep his amateur status and is donating the money to a specific non-profit organization. Unfortunate as it is for the skater who went for the money too soon, it is admirable that the organization makes no exceptions to its definition of a professional.

This fairly new organization seems to have some good solid thinking behind it. For more information call Nelson Burton, State Director for North Carolina at 919/799-4458. Richard Acunto is now traveling the country informing skateparks of his promising amateur organization. Keep your eyes and ears open — they sound like an organization to work with.



HESTER NO. 2 AT Pipeline

So we were on our way to the Badlands. The Hester #1 at Spring Valley was a good start. Not perfect, but good. The scoring system was revised, to everyone's relief, and plans set for the #2 Bowl Contest in the Hester-I.S.A. Series.

Hosted by the Pipeline Skatepark in Upland, Calif., contest hustle and bustle started early, as expected. Park owners, the Hoffman's, outdid themselves in hosting the event: fencing for the spectator area, sodas free to Officials, and an elevated platform for the judges. They really worked hard to help the contest. We heartily thank them.

Hot locals TAY HUNT, STEVE ALBA, and HARVEY HAWKS, among the rest, were keeping the pipe hot. Out of towners were working out in the hopes of looking good on some unfamiliar concrete. The Northern California boys - RICK BLACKHART, STEVE OLSON, were looking good and waiting for their chance at a contest in their home territory.

Poor weather was haunting Henry again as the rains started after the third One Wheelers run. We got the registration done and at least got started. Some encouragement. Hanging out one night was an event in itself (will we ever get black listed from hotels?)

Sunday was gorgeous! We started where we left off with the fourth run of the One Wheelers. Again a dramatic event. Every park should try one. DOUG SALADINO and TAY HUNT tied round after round. First they tied at 26 with FRANK BLOOD and STEVE ALBA. A run off tied them again at 27. The third run off had Pineapple 1st with 27 One Wheelers and Tay Hunt 2nd with 26. That event paid \$100 to First, \$50 for Second, and \$25 for Third Place.

The first round of Doubles was held on Sunday. Scored on team work and degree of difficulty, pairs competed on both days adding scores for final placings. They are finally getting the hang of working together and planning out a routine for this potentially photogenic event.

The Pipe Pasting event was fun. Entries got two tries to get highest in the pipe and put a sticker on the wall. The sticker had to stay up for the whole event. STEVE ALBA, again the quiet winner, pasted the highest and won \$100. 2nd Place - KIRT TALBOTT - paid \$50. 3rd Place - TAY HUNT - paid \$25.

The Freestyle Bowls event was a rouser. As at Spring Valley, there were some surprises as unexpected skaters didn't make the first cut. JIM SIGURDSON blew everybody away with a four foot flyaway from the bowl but he didn't advance.

The scoring was done Olympic style (1 to 10 with increments) on the whole routine, not just each maneuver as was done at Spring Valley. Skaters competed in "sessions." Five guys at a time in one "session" took turns at three runs of about 30 seconds each. This format is more like natural, spontaneous bowl riding. After a guy takes his run, he waits his turn. This gives him a chance to rest. Each run seems to take about half a minute. The Pros liked this arrangement.

The competition on Monday was great, Tay Hunt, steadily drawing The Lines, constantly pulled off some moves that literally blew everybody out of the water. It was his contest from the start.

So the Badlands Boys have two out of two events: Alba, first at the Spring Valley, and Hunt, first at Pipeline. The Series moves up North for the Hester #3 at a new park. To be held May 27, 28 at Ride On Skatepark, the hoards from the North can hardly wait. Rick Blackhart has been called the man to beat for this next one. But don't forget Steve Olson. Also from No. Cal. (Santa Cruz), Steve isn't 2nd Overall in the Series for no reason! He's a young, strong, determined Pro. One not to be overshadowed.

Hester's Series has generated some of the best energy in pro competition ever. He has attracted John Baron, of Pepsi, who gave a complimentary steak dinner for competitors and plans to do so at each stop in the Series. More sponsors want to get their banners up. "Skateboarder" Magazine recognizes the impact of this Series and plans to continue to give it full play. "Skateboard World" and "Wild World" are also keeping close tabs. No wonder - it's so hot!! When will TV pick up on it? It has to be the best spectator event skateboarding has.

CORFU, N.Y., — If you think you're ready to pit your skateboarding skill against other area racers, freestyle or bowlriders, the opportunity is coming soon.

Darien Lake Skateboard City, the huge skateboarding complex at Darien Lake Fun Country in Corfu, N.Y., has scheduled a series of Skateboard Competitions beginning Sunday, May 28 and ending with the Skateboard City Grand Championship on Sunday, Sept. 17.

The summer-long series will be co-sponsored by F & H Skateboards and Pepsi Cola of Batavia, and will be open to skateboarders of all ages, with separate competitions for youngsters under 14 and those 14 and over. Trophies will be awarded for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in each age group. Judging will be by a



EDITORIAL:





She has been on news programs and talk shows. She has been featured in Wild World of Skateboarding. She was filmed by the BBC on their last visit to the US.


Her other interests include motocross racing, car racing, and sky diving. She played semi-pro softball for three years. And besides her interest in all kinds of stunt work she loves to cook.





WOMENS Sports Hall of FAME









a.r.a. starts '78 season

Yea! The snow is melting up here in the Rockies and we are getting ready to roll.

Another Roadside Attraction, Inc., has been working to put together our second season of Colorado skateboard competition. The following schedule lists the projected dates, locations, and events which will be held at each contest.

The Professional and Amateur events in the schedule will not always include every Amateur racing class at each contest. For example, in all the Downhill (DH) competitions, only High School, adult amateurs (19 to 29 years), and Pros will be seeded to run. In the Dual Slalom (DS), the elementary, junior high, women, and geriatrics will compete on separate days from the high school, adult amateur, and Pros. You should review the circuit schedule so you are aware of the time allowances. We hope to tighten up the time involved needed to run all amateur and pro

This season a standardized entry and score card will be used for record keeping. Contestants will fill out one card the first time they show to race. This card will hold all personal race results for each contestant. This should facilitate our scoring procedures and make referencing the previous records easier. This procedure is consistent to both amateur and professional competitors.

A personalized bib will be issued to only Pro racers. The cost of the bib will be about \$30. The bibs are numbered according to the racer's previous season finish, or in order the rest of the new entrants register. The entry fee will be \$30 per event for Pros. The amount of each event's Pro purse has not been finalized to date. The purse for DS, Giant Slalom, and DH are designed to pay to 32 places, but that is subject to change.

Amateur racers will pay entry fees per event they enter. Competitors 11 years and under will pay \$3 per event. 12 years and older will pay \$4 per event. Every amateur will receive a bib the day of morning competition at registration. Season competition ticket rates are available to families and sponsored teams.

Rules and regulations and the point system will be available soon. We will have them at every contest as well as sending them to you prior to the season opener. Lodging lists will be available upon registering at each contest.

DH events will be of the Standup variety. Boards will have a wheel base of NO MORE THAN 36 INCHES. DH events will be held on mountain roads offering turns and occasional straight shots. DS will average between 30 and 42 cones. DS courses will be offset with some straight flushes (stingers). Surfaces are black top and asphalt. The cross country event in Dillon will be a mass start race. Freestyle will be a two-minute limit routine.

Amateur classes I (elementary women, and geriatrics) will compete against the clock in each event. The best of their two runs will count. Amateur classes II (Jr. High, High School, and Adult Amateur) will take two runs; both runs will be combined to count.

Safety equipment will be mandatory: elbow pads, knee pads, helmets, shirts, sneakers. We would like to recommend padded shorts.


